About the Position:

We are looking for an energetic, creative and independent professional to join the MCW team, working on the program management and development of our Young Leaders Program. The position is part-time starting immediately, and requires a dedication of up to 20 hours per week for one year, through August 2017.

The Young Leaders Program helps youth from around the world build the skills, confidence, and networks to achieve their goals and contribute positive social changes to their communities. The YLP intern will work closely with programmatic staff and support the various programmatic areas including the annual YLP retreat, the Alumni Ventures Fund, and the Alumni Community.

The scope of the position will include a wide variety of tasks such as working with an international group of youth Mentors and Young Leaders, supporting the logistics of the annual Young Leaders Program retreat, and leading and creating new outreach efforts for the alumni community. The YLP intern will also help develop program curriculum and workbooks, review applications, conduct interviews, research grant opportunities, and create program-relevant social media posts.

Candidates are reliable, organized, self-motivated, and able to work both independently and collaboratively. We are looking for individuals who can meet deadlines and handle multiple responsibilities. Interns will work with a team, and at times will be involved with miscellaneous tasks (e.g. Quarterly Socials, Annual Gala, etc.)
