Jacinda's passion is to build the financial and operational capacity within the organizations we support and has spent a considerable amount of time studying, traveling to and working in both Sub-saharan and West Africa regions. Jacinda holds a BA in history from the University of Washington and a Masters of Public Administration in Health Policy and Management with a specialization in Health Finance and International Health Policy from the Robert F. Wagner Graduate School of Public Service at New York University.
